


On the heels of Dockyard's distinction as the home of the 35th America's Cup, this former 19th-century working dockyard continues to up the ante as a one-stop shop for almost anything a visitor to Bermuda should desire.

DIVING INTO HISTORY

After losing the American War of Independence in 1783, and with no American ports at their disposal, Britain sought a port in the mid-Atlantic, between Halifax and the West Indies, from which it could face off America and France and also easily access its interests in the Caribbean. Bermuda's central geographic position, as you might guess, made it a prime choice.

In 1809, slaves laid the first local stones that would become Royal Naval Dockyard's foundation; and convicts from Britain followed as the next wave of labourers after emancipation. From the War of 1812 until just after World War II, Royal Naval Dockyard and the base played an integral role in strategic defence for Britain. It wasn't until 1951 that the Royal Navy officially pulled out from Bermuda. And in the first years after the Bermuda government purchased Dockyard in 1953, the area saw little use and began to fall into disrepair. But soon enough, plans were set in motion to preserve Dockyard as a public gathering ground and park.

AC35: WHAT'S NEXT?

In 2017, the 35th America's Cup made its way to Bermuda, where some of the best sailors in the world convened at the pinnacle of international sailing. It is not only the oldest trophy in international sport; it predates the modern Olympic Games by 45 years and is yachting's biggest prize.

Royal Naval Dockyard was certainly the island's most popular destination during America's Cup, and the storied sailing competition has left behind some major changes. Perhaps the most notable part of the transformation was the construction of Cross Island, a nine-acre land mass that was constructed in Dockyard's South Basin and whose first use was as the home of the America's Cup Event Village.

"It's undecided what we'll do with it yet, but at the moment, it's available for hosting events," says WEDCO Business Development Manager Joanna Cranfield. "It's a flat nine acres, so it lends itself to almost anything."

The America's Cup also left behind the great legacy of its Endeavour Program, which is headquartered in Dockyard. The programme provides sailing instruction as well as education on a range of related subjects and could very well lead to young Bermudians becoming world-class sailors in their own right.

NEW DOCKYARD DEVELOPMENTS

In a move that will bring the latest technology to this historically distinct site, visitors will soon be able to experience an immersive virtual reality environment at Royal Naval Dockyard. Guests will be whisked away and fully engrossed in a virtual world, made even more real by the sensations of movement and other sensory influences that truly engage the user in a digitally constructed environment.

Another popular form of entertainment, the escape room, is available at Royal Naval Dockyard. At Locked on the Rock, visitors race against the clock to decipher clues leading to their release from the room, which features uniquely Bermudian themes like Casemates Escape, The Tucker Cross and Cupmatch Hangover.


Dockyard is also at the forefront of one of the biggest changes in Bermuda's recent history — the introduction of rental cars, which up until June 2017 were not allowed on the island. Now, in addition to the popular scooter rentals and the island's reliable public transportation, visitors have the option of renting two-seater electric cars, which can be rented and recharged right in Dockyard.

Even as Dockyard changes and adapts to offer the latest forms of entertainment, this West End destination remains a hub for all sorts of activities.

"We have everything out here," says
Cranfield. "It's a destination unto itself.
There are retail offerings, a full complement
of restaurants, and working artisans making
pottery, blown glass, unique jewellery and
rum cakes. We have our own beach which
becomes a club by nightfall, a very popular
mini golf course, and the new Bermuda
Transport Museum, where every form of
transport that's been available in Bermuda
from day one is on display."



Exploring Bermuda's History

You can step back in time and immerse yourself in 500 years of Bermuda's History at The National Museum of Bermuda. But this isn't just any ordinary museum. Here are some things you won't want to miss:

The Exhibits

It's here where you can browse exhibits about the island and its culture, all displayed in historic military buildings of the Keep Fort in Dockyard. Learn about Bermuda's links with the Azores in Azores and Bermuda; centuries of seaborne history through Bermuda & The West Indies; slavery through The Slave Trade and Bermuda; shipwrecks and their artefacts through Shipwreck Island: Sunken Clues to Bermuda's Past; and even more exhibits that touch upon defence, prisoners, watercraft and even banknotes.


Research at the Museum

From underwater archaeology and land archaeology to genealogy research and image reproduction, the research conducted at this not-for-profit museum is fundamental to the museum. You can play a part by participating in one of the museum's archaeology field schools.

Kid-Friendly Fun

For those travelling with children in tow, the Museum Playground & Playhouse, designed by awardwinning Danish design company, Monstrum, includes a sand pit, lighthouse with slide, climbing elements and a 70-foot moray eel. The area is interactive, and teaches local history through play.








HOW TO GET THERE

Royal Naval Dockyard is easily accessible by scooter or rental car; by minibus or taxi; via Bermuda's iconic pink buses, which offer two routes from the City of Hamilton to Dockyard (\$5 per adult, \$2.75 per child ages 5–16); and by ferry from Hamilton, and from St. George's in the summer (\$5 per adult, \$2.75 per child ages 5–16). Visitors can also take advantage of the free train shuttle within Dockyard when cruise ships are in port or the boundless taxis and minibuses available. 



Explore the collection of small local watercraft and Shipwreck Island: Sunken Clues to Bermuda's Past, an exhibit showcasing Spanish gold, colonial trade goods and other artefacts recovered from local shipwrecks.
